Cahokia Mounds State Historic Site and Interpretive Center: The remains of the most sophisticated prehistoric native civilization north of Mexico are preserved at Cahokia Mounds State Historic Site. Within the 2,200-tract, located a few miles west of Collinsville, Illinois, lie the archaeological remnants of the central section of the ancient settlement that is today known as Cahokia. There are guided tours, field and group trips, an Interpretive Center and Trail maps available for visitors.
